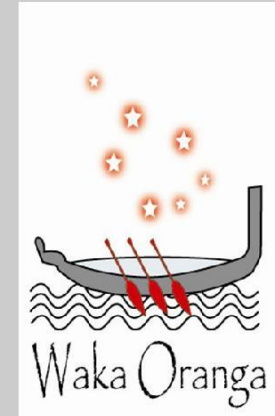

## WAKA ORANGA

Waka Oranga has been seeded from the ideas and aspirations of tangata whenua to achieve self-determination for whānau, hapū and iwi within Aotearoa. Waka Oranga are a roopu of Maori kaiwhakaruruhau led by kaumatua Haare Williams and Hinewirangi Kohu-Morgan.

Indigenous psychotherapy takes its proper and appropriate place alongside many other traditions that contribute to Maori health and wellbeing. In addition to mainstream education and training, we bring kaupapa Maori attitudes and values that enrich and extend our professional skill base and more importantly form the basis for a uniquely Maori practice of psychotherapy.

Te Tiriti o Waitangi provides the foundation for the political, economic, spiritual and social context of our life and our work. Maori psychotherapy practitioners hold that the needs and rights of individuals are indivisible from the needs and rights of whanau, hapū and iwi. In contrast to the unjust and unsustainable ethos of extreme individualism, we aspire for our clients and for ourselves, a benign human presence on the planet. Three fundamental aspects of this tikanga are environmental sustainability, social justice and spiritual fulfillment. We affirm that our intrapsychic reality is a microcosm and reflection of the wider world in which we live.

He aha te nui? He tangata, he tangata, he tangata.  
What is the most important thing? It is people, it is people, it is people.

Waka Oranga membership is open for anyone who supports our kaupapa. We believe this roopu will benefit the health and wellbeing of all people of this land. Our vision is for a nation of cultural diversity and richness, where its unity is underpinned by the free expression and wellbeing of tangata whenua.

## MEMBERSHIP OPTIONS

There are four different types of membership available:

### Waka Oranga Member

Available to those that whakapapa Maori, are trained and work as kaiwhakaruruhau (or equivalent) and can commit to organisational hui/wananga supporting the kaupapa of Waka Oranga.

### Institutional Member

Available to any group, organisation or institution upon payment of a subscription fee and approval of Te Runanga o Waka Oranga.

### Associate Member

Available to any individual upon payment of a subscription fee and approval of Te Runanga o Waka Oranga.

### Tauira Maori

Available to those Maori studying to become psychotherapists/kaiwhakaruruhau practitioners.

### Student Associate

Available to those students studying to become psychotherapy practitioners.
