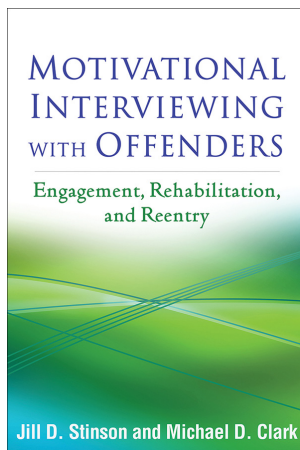
Michael Clark (MSW)
